Sec. 4. The College or School Departments

ART. 99. The President may recommend to the Board of Regents the organization of departments in the various colleges and schools on the basis of fields of study or disciplines.

ART. 100. The department staff shall consist of members of the teaching or research staff with the rank of assistant and above, including lecturers, who teach or do research work in the department.

ART. 101. A given department shall function in the college or school where the major part of its work is done and shall be assigned to such college by the President subject to the approval of the Board of Regents.

ART. 102. The chairman of the department shall be appointed by the Board of Regents upon nomination by the President after consultation with the Dean or Director concerned. The chairman of the department shall det crmine the administrative organization and conduct of the work of his department.

ART. 103. The tenure of office of the various chairmen of academic divisions and departments in all units of the University shall be three years, without prejudice to reappointment, and until their succes: sors shall have been appointed. ( 826 th $B / R$, Nov. 27,1972 superseding 783rd B/R, June 25, 1969. See also 701st B/R, Oct. 5, 1962).

ART. 104. Administrative matters affecting a department shall be subject to the control of the Dean or Director of the college or school, but academic matters shall be under the jurisdiction of the department chairman within the limitations herein set under the divisional scheme.

ART. 105. Meetings of the department stref may be held at least twice a semester and at such other times as may be called by the chairman or at the request of a majority of its members.
