- A. Rescission of the existing policy that "no tenure shall be given to faculty members below the rank of Associate Professor."
- B. Amendment of pertinent provisions of the Revised University Code governing faculty tenure (all revisions are asterisked):
  - 1. All initial appointments to the faculty (at whatever rank) shall be temporary.
  - \* a. <u>Initial</u> appointment at the rank of Asst., Assoc., or full Professor requires that appointee has graduate or professional degree, or outstanding academic, creative, or professional work. (The proposed revisions here are: that criteria are now specified for <u>initial</u> appointment at the rank of Assoc. Prof. or Prof.; and the addition of the word "creative".)
    - b. All must serve for at least one year.
    - c. Maximum period of temporary appointment -
      - (1) as Instructor: 5 years
      - (2) as Asst. Prof.: 3 years
      - (3) as Assoc. Prof.: 2 years
      - (4) as Professor: 1 year
    - d. After this maximum period, the appointment terminates unless -
    - \* (1) Instructor is promoted to the rank of Asst. Prof., with or without tenure;

    - In 1977, tenure could start even at the rank of Instructor (BR, 30 June 1977).
    - In 1986, tenure started only at the rank of Associate Professor (BR. 24 April 1986).

- \* 3. Appointee must be officially notified by the Dean 60 days, before termination of appointment. (The only proposed revision here is: "by the Dean")
- # 4. Promotion of instructor to the rank of Asst. Prof.: instructor must have graduate or professional degree, or outstanding academic, <u>creative</u>, or professional work. (The only proposed revision here is: "creative")
- \* 5. Tenury and promotion are <u>separate</u>: no promotion in rank necessarily carries tenure with it.

ART. 180. Appointments to the faculty on a contract basis shall not be governed by the above rules on tenure but by the terms of the contract.

ART. 176c. <u>Promotions in rank.</u>Promotion in rank shall not necessarily carry tenure with it;
that is, promotion is a separate
matter from faculty tenure.
