ART. 193. A sabbatical assignment for not longer than one year, with full or partial payment of salary, may be granted to a member of the faculty if, in the judgment of the President and the Board of Re-System gents, his record as a teacher or researcher in the University/shows reasonable assurance of fulfillment of the purposes of the assignment as expressed in the foregoing article; <u>Provided</u>, That he has served System the University/for not less than six consecutive years, the last two years of which with a mank not lower than associate professor. If spent abroad, full transportation payment shall be provided by the University System.*

Sec. 11. Teaching Load

ART. 194. A teaching load of 12 hours a week for each faculty member shall be required; <u>Provided, however</u>, That no member of the faculty shall teach less than 6 hours per week.** (822nd B/R, July 31, 1972, superseding amendment introduced at 710th B/R, June 7, 1963).

ART. 195. The teaching load above prescribed shall be reduced in case a member of the faculty is engaged either in research, creative writing, or other productive scholarship or is assigned to perform administrative or committee work, and in such cases the following rules shall apply:

a. The maximum credit load for research work, creative writing or any other form of productive scholarship shall be six hours per week;

This will give the faculty member concerned a regular load of 13 1/3 hours and 16 2/3 hours per week, respectively.

This is subject to the condition that the reduction in teaching load will not entail additional budgetary outlay.
