3. Laboratory fee of P500.00 per laboratory course

This new degree program will contribute to a deeper understanding of pressing socio-economic and political issues ranging from those that arose from the historical interaction among the Lumad/IP, Bangsa Moro and diverse settlers to those resulting from the metropolitanization of key cities in Mindanao.

B. Proposed Amendment to Package of Incentives for Faculty Administrators

In its 1161st meeting on 25 July 2002, the Board of Regents approved a package of incentives for faculty administrators to make administrative assignments more enticing to qualified members of the faculty. The incentives include research (dissemination) grants to support research activities of these faculty administrators.

When the package of incentives was proposed, the directors of systems offices (Admissions, CIDS, U.P. Press, CWS), whose responsibilities are equally demanding, were somehow left out. It is now proposed that the directors of these offices, provided they are members of the faculty, be included.

words in brackets [**] to be deleted. Note also that references to the UPCB Dean/Associate Deans are also being deleted as these positions have been elevated to Chancellor/Vice Chancellors, respectively, after the grant of CU status to U.P. Baguio.

1. For Deans, [and] Vice Chancellors [/Associate Deans, UPCB, and], Registrars, DIRECTORS OF SYSTEM OFFICES (ADMISSIONS, CIDS, U.P. PRESS, CWS): Research support for a paper or creative work in the form of one research (dissemination) grant during the term of the faculty administrator, to be provided by the CU FOR CAMPUS LEVEL OFFICIALS, AND BY THE SYSTEM FOR SYSTEM DIRECTORS.
2. For President, Chancellors [/Dean, U.P. College Baguio], Vice Presidents, Assistant Vice Presidents, Secretary of the University, Assistant Secretary, University General Counsel: Research support for a paper or creative work in the form of a research (dissemination) grant every year during the term of the faculty administrator, to be provided by the System.
3. For President, Chancellors [/Dean, U.P. College Baguio], Vice Presidents, Assistant Vice Presidents, Secretary of the University, Assistant Secretary, Vice Chancellors, [/Associate Deans of UPCB], University General Counsel: Financial assistance of up to P10,000 for the annual executive check-up at PGH, to be provided by the CU for campus level officials and by the System for system officials.

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4. For faculty administrators with 12-unit administrative load credit applying for a professorial chair: Requirement of research track record in lieu of teaching performance for eligibility for the Chair except for GE Chairs; removal of requirement that faculty administrator must teach while occupying the Chair except for GE Chairs, provided requirements are met (read or publish the Chair lecture).

C. **Abolition of the Diploma in Language and Literature, College of Arts and Communication, U.P. Baguio**

Background

Instituted in 1995, the Diploma in Language and Literature (DLL) served for six years as a continuing education program for basic education teachers of the Cordillera and other Northern Luzon provinces. As envisioned the program addressed the need of teachers in the region for professional development in language and literature teaching. Support in the form of tuition scholarships from the University sustained most of the program's clientele.

When it was instituted, the DLL program was regarded as preparatory to the offering of a full-blown master's program in language and literature. In 1997, the Master of
