IV. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETINGS

A. 1121st BOR Meeting (25 June 1998)

1. On the term of Deans and Directors

In the last Board meeting, Regent Alfonso wondered whether there should be a provision for the third and last term for deans.

A subsequent review of the Board's policies pertaining to the terms of deans and directors disclosed that at its 1020th meeting on April 25, 1989, the Board adopted the policy that a dean or director may serve two terms and that only in exceptional cases will they be allowed a third term. The pertinent portion of the minutes of the said meeting (V, D) is quoted hereunder:

"D. The Board also <u>agreed</u> to set a limit to the number of terms a dean or director may serve. Deans and directors may serve <u>two</u> terms. Only in highly exceptional cases will they be allowed a third term."

The same provision is stipulated in Art. 79, as amended, of the Revised University Code, governing the term of office of deans and directors as follows:

"Art. 79. The term of office of all deans and directors heads of degree-granting schools institutes and that directors of non-degree-granting units, university departments, and college programs shall be three years from the date of their vears from the date of appointment without prejudice to reappointment and until successors shall have appointed; provided, that deans and directors may serve for two terms; provided, further, that only in highly exceptional cases shall they be allowed a third term."

(As amended at these B/R meetings: 779th, Jan. 31, 1969; 826th, Nov. 27, 1972; Dec. 11, 1972; 1016th, Sept. 22, 1988; and 1020th, April 25, 1989).

As thus provided, the Board accordingly adopted the policy that henceforth, "all appointments to deanship shall carry the condition that the dean shall continue to serve as such until his successor qualifies and assumes office."

Following an exchange of Board action: views on whether the qualifying phrase "may serve for two terms" is to be construed in the sense of consecutive or in the aggregate, the consensus arrived at was that the phrase should be understood as "two terms in the aggregate." The Board, therefore, decided that ART. 79 of the Revised University Code Art. amended accordingly. be should now read as follows 79 (words in capital letters to be added):

> "Art. 79. The term of office of all deans and directors or heads of degree-granting schools institutes and that and directors of non-degree-granting units, university departments, and college programs shall be three from the date of their appointment without prejudice to reappointment and until their successors shall have appointed; provided, that deans and directors may serve for two terms AGGREGATE; provided, IN THE in highly further, that only exceptional cases shall they be allowed a third term."
