XI. MATTERS FOR CONFIRMATION OF THE BOARD

The **Board CONFIRMED** the following:

A. Revision of the Rule on Automatic Promotion for Obtaining Ph.D.



The present rule discourages Instructors from proceeding to a Ph.D. at their rank because when they return with their degree, they will be given the same rank as Assistant Professors who have just obtained their M.A./M.S. At the same time, the rule assures Assistant Professors that they will automatically be promoted to Associate Professor rank the later they begin their studies (at Assistant Professor III rank) and the longer they take (assuming they are promoted one or two steps for merit while taking their Ph.D.)

Note also that a Ph.D. who is hired through lateral entry is given a starting rank of Assistant Professor III, while an Instructor who obtains a Ph.D. is only granted Assistant Professor I rank upon his/her return.

The revised rule thus aims to encourage Instructors to take their Ph.D. as soon as they can by assuring them of a higher rank promotion than if they were to begin their Ph.D. studies at a later age and higher rank. It also closes the gap between lateral entrants with a Ph.D. and returning Instructors with a Ph.D.

The revised rule also suggests that promotion to Associate Professor and Professor ranks cannot simply be obtained through a Ph.D. The merit aspect should become more significant the higher the rank. Hence while the Assistant Professor rank can be used to recognize advanced degrees, the Associate and Professor ranks must be based on merit. The cut-off rank has to be Assistant Professor III because under the present rule, that rank is automatically raised to the rank of Associate Professor I upon completion of the Ph.D.

The revised rule therefore requires faculty who obtain their Ph.D. at the rank of Assistant Professor III and above to show proof of merit - apart from their Ph.D. degree - in order to be promoted to the rank of Associate Professor.

The new rule shall apply to the 2000 promotions.
